

MGT Eastern Extension Project
Open House Questions and Answers
Gallatin, TN – November 18, 2004

Parcel 13, 13.5

MP 10.5

Question:

Landowner concerned about routing of pipeline through the middle of the parcel. Landowner indicated the structure at MP10.5 is used for storage, not as residence.

Response:

Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT proposes to revise the pipeline route towards the west property line.

Parcel 40

MP 12.6

Question:

Landowner suggested using the 50' access easement on parcel 25.05 in lieu of crossing parcel 40.

Response:

MGT will review suggested routing alternative.

Parcel 19

MP13.3

Question:

Pipeline is cutting across 12-acre field on Womack Road. Would like to reroute pipeline so it does not divide property.

Response:

Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT proposes to revise the pipeline route NE towards Womack road per landowner's request.

Parcel 42.0

MP14.8

Question:

Landowner concerned about the proximity of the pipeline to the dam on the south end of property at MP 14.9. Looks like pipe will need to be shifted slightly East to miss dam structure. Pipeline also crosses creek twice.

Response:

MGT will review this portion of the route and evaluate the possibility of a change in alignment to avoid impacting the dam structure. MGT will minimize potential impacts at waterbody crossings through engineering and construction practices.

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Parcel 22.01 MP 15.4

Question:

Landowner owner concerned with the pipeline route and the potential conflict with the Indian encampment and waterfall located on Parcel 22.01. Also has TN forest management plan in place for property #4358.

Response:

MGT will conduct environmental and cultural resource surveys to identify resources that could be affected by construction activities. Landowner would like to be notified of schedule for environmental surveys and possibly be present during survey. Subject to the results of environmental/cultural surveys, and design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT will evaluate possible reroutes to avoid the significant resources (waterfall and encampment).

Parcel 4 MP17

Question:

Landowner concerned with potential damage to the creek used to flow water to his cows. Doesn't like the idea of having pipeline cross his property.

Response:

MGT will minimize potential impacts at water body crossings through engineering and construction practices. Following construction, MGT will restore all areas disturbed by construction as nearly as practicable to the original contours.

Parcel 16 MP18.0

Question:

Landowner concerned with location of route and future building site in NW corner of property. Also concerned about blasting and the effects on the water well. Suggests moving pipeline along James Penn Road and along north property line.

Response:

Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT proposes to revise the pipeline route slightly south, which will avoid the building site in the NW corner of the Parcel. Prior to construction, MGT will identify all drinking-water supply wells and springs within 150 feet of construction work areas and implement measures to ensure well yield and water quality are not affected by construction activities.

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Parcel 15 **MP18.6**

Question:

Landowner to build house where pipeline is currently routed in Parcel 15. Landowner also indicates there is a deep gulch on the property at MP 18.3. Suggests rerouting the line south to avoid ditch and gulch. No problems elsewhere on property.

Response:

MGT will examine possibility of an alternative route across property to minimize impact upon proposed home and to improve constructability in ditch/gulch area.

Parcel 3, 78 **MP20.3**

Question:

Landowner requested change of route on Parcels 3 and 78.

Response:

Advised landowner of route change to the north property line on Parcel 3 and to the south property line through Parcel 78. Route now appears acceptable to landowner.

Parcel 33 **MP22.3**

Question:

Landowner concerned with dividing parcel with pipeline. Plans to develop land in the future. Would like pipeline to follow south and west property lines north to Old Hopewell Road.

Response:

This proposed relocation would require a significant amount of additional pipe, which is not practical. MGT will continue to work with landowner to develop an acceptable solution for the crossing of this property.

Parcel 16.0 **MP 26.7**

Question:

Landowner is concerned with the proposed location of pipeline on Parcel 16.0. There is a barn located west of proposed route near property line. Landowner requests the line be moved to the south.

Response:

Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT will examine revising the pipeline route slightly south to follow tree line.
