

MGT Eastern Extension Project
Open House Questions and Answers
Hartsville, TN – November 16, 2004

Parcel 38.07, 43.08 MP13.6

Questions:

Parcel 38.07 has been divided into four parcels running lengthwise with road access. Landowner prefers not to dissect those four parcels. Line must also be routed to miss the house and barn on parcel 43.08. There is also a spring near the corner of the road.

Response:

Will continue to look at both locations to lessen impact. Crossing of Buttermilk Hollow and other design, engineering and permitting concerns will determine alignment across properties.

Parcel 43.04, 38.07, 43.08 MP14.1

Question:

Landowner opposes pipeline on his property, sees no benefit. Landowner also owns property off Womack Road. House and barn located on Parcel 43.08.

Response:

Pipeline is currently not routed on Parcel 43.04, however the pipeline is currently proposed to be routed on Parcels 43.08 and 38.07. Subject to design, engineering, permitting and other landowners' concerns, the pipeline may be shifted slightly south to increase the separation between the pipeline and the existing home and barn on Parcel 43.08. This alignment would also provide a better approach for crossing Buttermilk Hollow Road.

Parcel 29, 93 MP 16.4

Question:

Landowner does not see any benefit for the pipeline, and therefore does not want pipeline located on either property.

Response:

Proposed pipeline is currently routed just north of the south property line of Parcel 29. The currently proposed pipeline route would cross Parcel 93, in a NW to SE direction. Landowner prefers to have pipeline routed along south and west property lines of Parcel 93. Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, we will work with landowner to see if it is possible to change routing through Parcel 93 per landowner's request.

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Parcel 18, 18.01, 18.02

MP21.3

Question:

Landowner would like the pipeline placed further north along the north property line. Owner is in process of building a cabin and has a well located near pipeline route.

Response:

MGT met with landowner and, subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, agreed to locate the pipeline approximately 25' off north property line in Parcels 18 and 18.01. Will protect existing natural rock field fence located on north property line.

Parcel 20, 21, 22 MP 24.9

Question:

Concerned with proximity of proposed pipeline to existing homes in Parcels 20, 21, and 22. Wants to make sure route provides as much clearance as possible

Response:

MGT will review routing and, subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, will work to maximize separation between existing homes and proposed pipeline route in this location.

Parcel 19

MP26.1

Questions:

Currently building a new house on tract 19. Only location to build due to rock and suitable septic location is toward the rear of property.

Response:

Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT proposes to co-locate the pipeline within an existing power line easement in this location and will work to keep the pipeline located as near as practical to the existing power line easement through the adjoining parcels. MGT will attempt to minimize any additional tree clearing in this area.

Parcel 23

MP27.4

Question:

Landowner concerned with potential of pipeline construction to damage existing waterline. Waterline runs from well to house near MP 27.4.

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Response:

Subject to design, engineering, permitting, and other landowners' concerns, MGT will route pipeline to avoid well. Prior to construction, existing water and utility lines located within the construction corridor will be identified and marked in the field. MGT is required to maintain potable water supplies to residents during the construction period and would repair or replace any waterline affected by construction during final restoration.

Parcel 4.05 MP28.1

Question:

Would like to locate pipeline closer to the north property line before turning south.

Response:

The proposed pipeline is no longer routed through Parcel 4.05.

Parcel 4.04 MP28.2

Question:

Why does the East Tennessee connection need to be at Texas Eastern versus further west along of the East Tennessee line? Landowner also owns Parcel 4.05 and part of Parcel 4.02. House and barns are along old Hwy 25.

Response:

East Tennessee has no pipeline capacity west of the proposed tie-in point.
The proposed pipeline is no longer routed on Parcel 4.04.

Parcel 4.0 MP28.5

Question:

Landowner is concerned with property devaluation. Landowner is opposed to having the pipeline cross the property.

Response:

The proposed pipeline is no longer routed on Parcel 4.0.

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Parcel 7

MP28.7

Question:

Pipeline currently routed through house. South of house is septic and shop. Ok to route pipeline between shop and septic.

Response:

The proposed pipeline is no longer routed on the Parcel 7.

Parcel 38

MP29.9

Question:

Concerned about potential noise level at interconnect site. Expressed concern about the existing noise at the existing East Tennessee Interconnect site.

Response:

All piping equipment will be designed to comply with the Federal and State noise level requirements. Where appropriate, pressure or flow control equipment will be placed within a building or below grade.
