Survey Policy

MGT's Right of Way Agents are trained in accordance with the following policy:

Survey Policy:

Right-of-Way Agents are to contact landowners/tenants for permission to survey and request that the landowner/tenant execute the Survey Permission form (attached). In cases where landowner/tenant grants verbal permission a report is to be written to document the permission granted.

Right-of-Way Agents are to provide notification in person or via telephone to the landowner/tenants that granted survey permission in advance of survey crews entering the property.

Right-of-Way Agents are to advise survey crews of the tracts that have granted survey permission, carry copies of the executed Survey Permission forms during survey activities and accompany survey crews during their survey activities.

Right-of-way Agents are to document any damages resulting from survey activities and contact the landowner/tenant to resolve the issue.

Report on Process Server incident that was conveyed by a landowner at FERC's
February 24, 2005 Scoping Meeting

A process server acting on behalf of Midwestern Gas Transmission Company ("Midwestern") delivered a summons and petition for entry on land for preliminary survey to Mr. Brenda Carter, 1520 Lauderdale Lane, Bethpage, TN on January 15, 2005. On February 8, 2005, attorney Frank M. Fly served an answer to the petition upon attorneys representing Midwestern. On February 24, 2005 at the FERC Scoping Meeting, Ms. Carter reported that a process server looked in and beat on her daughter's bedroom window prior to serving Ms. Carter the papers. She stated that she called the clerk's office to inquire about the service of process and the clerk's office advised that Ms. Carter could call the attorney's office that was representing Midwestern to inquire further. Ms. Carter stated that she did not pursue that.

Neither Ms. Carter nor her attorney, Mr. Fly, contacted Midwestern, or its attorneys, to advise of the conduct of the process server. No complaints regarding the conduct of the process server were received by Midwestern or its attorneys. Midwestern regrets this incident and has discussed this matter with its attorneys. In response to this matter, if it becomes necessary to use a process server in the future, Midwestern will review the activity with its attorneys to assure that an appropriate method of service is conducted.
